### **Resumption of Level Assemblies**

There are updates on new Safe Management Measures (SMMs) Guidelines with effect from 19 April 2021. Students will proceed to their respective classrooms or the school hall on designated days from 7.05 a.m. Provisions will be made for the staggering of students entering and leaving the school hall to minimise congestion at the entry and exit points.

Please ensure you perform the checks stated below before following the steps or sharing them with your family and friends.

#### 'VACCINATION' AGAINST FAKE WEBSITES



##### 1<sup>st</sup> Dose:

##### Check the Address Bar

- ☐ Ensure there is a padlock icon and the website address contains HTTPS.
- ☐ Check the domain name of the URL to make sure you are visiting the website you intend to. A minor typo might escape your attention.



##### 2<sup>nd</sup> Dose:

##### Check the Language

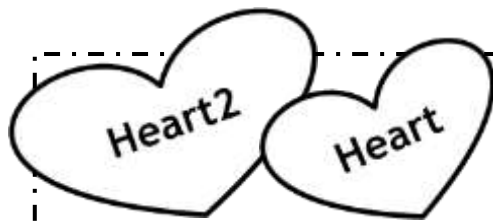
- ☐ Look out for spelling and grammar errors. A genuine website will not have these errors.
- ☐ Pay attention to these small details and stay safe away from fake websites.

##### 3<sup>rd</sup> Dose:

##### Check for Misinformation

- ☐ If the website offers a deal too good to be true, then probably it is not real.
- ☐ Check for manipulation techniques (e.g. excessive emotional language, false testimony of fake experts).
- ☐ Cross-reference the content with other reliable sources.

# Tips on Setting Realistic Parenting Expectations



Very often, high expectations can challenge us to strive further and achieve bigger things. However, unrealistic expectations may result in anxiety, loss of confidence and low self-esteem in children. Glean some tips from the infographic below on 5 practical tips to manage our expectations so that our children are motivated to learn at their own pace.

**01. Pay attention to what they say**  
Listen to your children and understand their point of view.

**02. Set goals together**  
Talk about their strengths, abilities and goals and how they can achieve them.

**03. Don't compare**  
celebrate their successes instead of comparing with others.

**04. Tell them it's okay to make mistakes**  
If they stumble, let them get back up and reassure them that you're there to talk and help.

**05. Don't focus only on results**  
Encourage them to pursue their strengths, interests and try new things.
