

Learning with Technology - Code for Fun

The Primary 4 Frontierers participated in the Code for Fun (CFF) enrichment programme on Computational Thinking in January. This programme provided them the opportunity to learn basic coding and computational thinking skills. They learnt how to programme a Sphero to create movement using their Sphero Robotic Kits. Using block programming, our Frontierers gained new knowledge in programming concepts such as events, loops, variables, and functions while they unleashed their creativity during the sessions.

Our Primary 6 Frontierers will undergo the SwimSafer 2.0 Programme as a post-PSLE activity.














G.R.E.A.T Highlights - Rigour in Learning

Buddy Reading Programme

The Buddy Reading Programme (English Language) supports emergent readers in Primary 2. It provides the opportunity to help these Frontierers improve their reading skills. A group of Primary 4 Frontierers with good reading and speaking skills, driven by their interest to serve and contribute, has volunteered to engage and motivate their juniors in reading twice a week in the morning before the flag-raising ceremony. These Primary 4 Frontierers exercise student agency by acting responsibly and contributing actively to help improve the reading proficiency level of their juniors.











Maker Education Workshops

Frontier Primary School conducted two Maker Education workshops for our passionate Frontierers on Monday, 30 January and Friday, 24 February 2023. These workshops aim to develop the creative and innovative thinking skills in our Frontierers and provide them with the platform to design, experiment and invent in Maker Education activities. It is heartening to see an enthusiastic sign-up rate with full attendance!

In the first workshop, our Frontierers learnt how to make no-sew pouches out of recycled materials under the guidance of our teachers. They were very engaged during the entire making process and their happy faces showed how much pride they had in making their pouches.

Primary 5 Interdisciplinary Project Work (IPW)

Our Primary 5 Frontierers took on the role of Young Explorers to examine issues related to Environmental Conservation during their IPW from Monday, 20 February to Thursday, 23 February 2023. IPW is a learning experience which aims to provide our Frontierers with the opportunity to synthesise knowledge from various areas of learning, and critically and creatively apply it to real-life situations.

Our Primary 5 Frontierers learnt about protecting habitats such as wetland reserves, finding sustainable ways to live on this planet and improving recycling efforts through a customised virtual learning journey to one of the following places:

- Mangrove (Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserves)
- Marine Coastal Intertidal Walk
- Coney Island Rustic Exploration

They also had the opportunity to examine artefacts of a few endangered marine species found in Singapore. They worked collaboratively on the design, creation and presentation of a brochure to highlight the importance of the environmental conservation. During these four days of interaction with their peers, they honed their collaboration and communication skills through the in-depth discussion and presentation respectively.
