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
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#### **Lower Primary Games Day & Primary 3 to 6 Sports Day**

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

#### **Primary 1: Building Skills Through Play**






Game 2: In a fun mix of luck and skill, Frontierers aimed to bounce three table tennis balls into an egg tray, cheering one another on with every try.
